Whānau Ora Essence

- Restoring collective roles and responsibilities
- Building whānau capability; nurturing resilience
- Strengthening whānau connections; reinvigorating the wealth of whakapapa
- Focus on enhancing best outcomes for whānau
- Interdependence not reliance on the state

- Places whānau at the centre, reflects their aspirations.
- Focused on whānau as a whole, builds on their strengths and increases their capacity.
- Focused on whānau outcomes, whānau generation of solutions and leadership development.

Whānau Ora – Governance Group

- Facilitate implementation
- Provide advice to the Minister Responsible for Whānau Ora
- Provide leadership to government agencies and stakeholders
- Provide leadership and direction at a national and regional level on Whānau Ora



Whānau Ora – Regional Leadership Groups

- 10 Regional Leadership Groups
- Te Puni Kōkiri, Ministry of Social Development, District Health Board officials; and community representatives appointed by the Minister
- Role:
 - Lead strategic change for Whānau Ora in regions
 - Foster communications and relationships
 - Provide advice and recommendation to Governance Group



Whānau Ora Funding

Service Delivery Capability - \$17.1m.

- For up to 20 providers through EOI process.
- To streamline existing contracts and deliver integrated services to whānau.

Whānau Integration, Innovation & Engagement - \$6.6m.

- Funding through NGOs to invest in whānau capacity and capability.
- Activities that build whānau connections; support whānau leadership; enhance best outcomes.



Whānau Ora - Integration

- One set of contract negotiations
- A single point of relationship management
- Align and reduce reporting obligations
- Opportunity for conducting audits and approvals concurrently



Whānau Ora - Action Research

- Action research approach for research, evaluation and monitoring to gauge the success of the design, implementation and impact.
- Whānau involved in regular review process to check progress and ensure whānau priorities are addressed in the way they envisaged.
